CANDIDATE INFORMATION

QUALIFICATIONS

A <u>City Council</u> candidate must meet the following qualifications as set forth in Arizona Revised Statutes § 9-232 (at the time of the election):

- be eighteen (18) years of age or older
- be a qualified elector of the City of Yuma
- have resided in the City of Yuma or in any area annexed to the City, for at least one year prior to the election

A <u>Municipal Judge</u> candidate must meet the following qualifications as set forth in Article XI, Section 3(d) of the Yuma City Charter:

- be at least 30 years of age
- be of good moral character with no felony convictions
- a resident of the City of Yuma for five years preceding the day of election or appointment

ELECTIVE OFFICES TO BE FILLED

* The annual salary may change based on the outcome of Proposition 420 at the November 7, 2023, Special Election. **Salary set through the Yuma City Council by ordinance.

SIGNATURE REQUIREMENTS

The nonpartisan nomination petition must contain the signatures of not less than three percent (3%) nor more than five percent (5%) of the total number of valid ballots cast at the preceding General Municipal Election (November 2022). The required number of signatures to qualify for the 2024 Primary Election ballot is no less than 675 and no more than 1,124 signatures of qualified electors of the City of Yuma.

MAJORITY TO ELECT IN PRIMARY ELECTION

Any candidate who receives, in the Primary Election (July 30, 2024), a majority of votes of all the ballots cast (50% + 1), will be declared elected to the office for which he/she is a candidate, as of the date of the General Election (November 5, 2024). If more candidates receive a majority of votes of all the ballots cast than there are offices to be filled, those candidates, equal to the number of offices to be filled, receiving the highest number of votes shall be declared elected as set forth in Article IV, Section 5 of the Yuma City Charter.

CAMPAIGN INFORMATION

This campaign information serves as a guideline to incumbent and non-incumbent candidates during the election campaigns:

- Use of the City's logo on campaign material and related communication platforms, such as social media accounts is prohibited.
- Unlawful acts of electioneering and violations of the "seventy-five foot limit" are subject to a class 2 misdemeanor, as prescribed in A.R.S § 16-1018 & §16-515.
- Arizona Revised Statutes § 9-500.14 prohibits the use of City resources to influence elections
- All legally declared incumbent and non-incumbent candidates for any elected office will not receive air time on any City of Yuma television/radio programming, other than regularly scheduled coverage of City Council meetings and other official City events. This restriction shall remain in effect until after the applicable August and/or November election.
- All legally declared incumbent and non-incumbent candidates for any elected office will not issue any newsletters, brochures and/or printed, electronic or web-based information updates that are produced with City dollars. This restriction shall remain in effect until after the applicable August and/or November election.
- All documents filed as part of the candidate nomination requirements, are subject to Arizona Public Record Laws.
- Materials provided by the City of Yuma are intended to assist in meeting the requirements of candidacy. However, it is the candidate's responsibility to see that all legal requirements have been met. All candidates should familiarize themselves with election requirements and should seek legal counsel, if necessary, regarding questions about candidate requirements and/or qualifications.

CANDIDATE FILING INFORMATION

CANDIDATE STATEMENT OF INTEREST [click here]

The Candidate Statement of Interest is required to be filed by a person prior to obtaining signatures on a candidate nomination petition.

NONPARTISAN NOMINATION PAPER/DECLARATION OF QUALIFICATION [click here]

The Nomination Paper provides written notification of an individual's intent to become a candidate for office and requests sufficient information to indicate that the person will be qualified to hold the office.

NONPARTISAN NOMINATION PETITIONS [click here]

A Nonpartisan Nomination Petition is signed by qualified electors who support the nomination of the individual whose name appears in the certificate portion. Only those persons who are qualified electors of the State of Arizona **and the City of Yuma** may sign a nomination petition. A person may sign a nomination petition for only one candidate for each office vacancy. For this election, an individual may sign up to three nomination petitions for City Councilmember and one nomination petition for Presiding Municipal Judge.

The petition circulator must be qualified to register to vote in the State of Arizona and, if not a resident of this State, shall register as a circulator with the Secretary of State. Each petition must be signed by the circulator who circulated that petition. The circulator's name shall be typed or printed under his/her signature along with circulator's actual residence address. The circulator shall verify that, in his/her belief, each signer was a qualified elector who resides at the address given as the signer's residence on the date indicated.

FINANCIAL DISCLOSURE STATEMENT [click here]

A Financial Disclosure Statement must be filed by any candidate running for public office. The statement shall cover the preceding twelve-month period.

POLITICAL ACTION COMMITTEE [click here]

Each candidate committee that intends to accept contributions or make expenditures, in any combination, of at least five hundred dollars (\$500) shall file a Committee Statement of Organization with the City Clerk's Office. All committees are required to file campaign finance reports as required by Title 16, Chapter 6 of the Arizona Revised Statutes.

As a candidate, you must file a Statement of Organization with the filing officer within ten days of meeting the committee criteria. For additional requirements and restrictions refer to A.R.S. § 16-905 and § 16-906.

✓ Checklist for Filing

The following forms with original signatures must be filed **at the same time** in the City Clerk's Office, Yuma City Hall, One City Plaza, Yuma, Arizona **no later than 5:00 p.m.**, Monday, April 1, 2024, for the official filing of a candidate:

- 2. Nonpartisan Nomination Petitions
- 3. Financial Disclosure Statement
- 4. Political Action Committee Statement of Organization (see requirements above if not already filed)



CANDIDATE GUIDE

HOW TO CREATE A NOMINATION PETITION ONLINE

Candidates running for county, city, town, and precinct committeeman office in Arizona may collect 100% of their required nomination petition signatures through the E-Qual system. E-Qual enables eligible voters to electronically sign these petitions. Arizona Online Petition Portal allows candidates to create and manage their online nomination petitions for elections by participating jurisdictions. The use of this system is authorized by <u>Arizona Revised Statutes § 16-317 (A)</u>.

In addition to electronic petitions, paper petitions will still be accepted and are encouraged as a supplement to the online signatures for the purpose of building a cushion. When circulating petitions in hard copy, please make sure the information on the paper forms matches the information on the electronic forms.

Before any signature is collected, a Statement of Interest form must be filed with your election office.

For candidates who do not wish to use the E-Qual system, the existing hard copy nomination petition process can still be used as an alternate option.

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CREATE AN ACCOUNT OR LOG IN IF YOU HAVE AN ACCOUNT

Please note, local candidates CANNOT use the regular Arizona Candidate Portal. The regular Arizona Candidate Portal is used for federal, legislative or state candidacy. Local candidates must use the Arizona Online Petition Portal for local offices.

2. CREATE NEW ACCOUNT

If you have never used E-QUAL as a candidate, click 'Create New Account' from the top menu bar or 'Sign Up Today' on the home page.

If you have run for a federal, legislative or state office, you can sign in using the same log in information (user name/password) that you use to sign into the regular Arizona Candidate Portal.

3. FILL OUT THE FORM

Fill out the form and click 'Create My Account'.

You should get a message saying that a confirmation email has been sent to your email. Go to your email inbox. Open the email that was sent from the Arizona Secretary of State. Click the link inside to confirm your email. You should now be able to log in to the petition portal. If you are not seeing the e-mail after a few minutes, check your spam folder.

4. LOG IN

Enter your account email address and password and click 'Log In'.

From the drop-down menu under 'Jurisdiction' select the jurisdiction. Under 'Election Year', select the election's year if it hasn't been automatically selected for you. Under 'Office' select which office you are seeking. If the election is partisan, you will have to also select your party. If more than one election is returned, select the election you are running in.

Click 'Next' to go to the next screen. Note: If there is only one option in a dropdown, that option will automatically be selected for you.

Important Reminders for Candidates:

- 1. When typing your name into the 'Candidate Name' field, type your name as you would like to see it appear on the ballot.
- 2. In the 'Address' field, a physical (residential) address is required. Do not enter any PO box addresses.
- 3. Review the information entered carefully before creating a new petition. Once a petition is created, the information cannot be modified. If changes are needed, the petition would need to be voided (releasing any signatures collected to that point) or closed, and a new petition created.
- 4. Please contact your Election Office with any questions.

DOUBLE CHECK YOUR INFORMATION! Once your petition has been created, the **ONLY** way to change this information is to void (remove all signatures) or close (cannot accept new signatures) your petition and create a new one with the correct information. **THE INFORMATION PROVIDED HERE GOES ON YOUR PETITION!** After you have reviewed your information, click "Next".

On the third and final screen, you will be asked to review the petition text.

Once you click on 'Create Petition' the information on the petition CANNOT be changed. If you wish to change anything at this point, click 'Previous' before clicking on 'Create Petition.' Once everything looks good, click 'Create Petition" to finish the creation process.

HOW TO VOID A PETITION

1. UNDERSTAND WHAT VOIDING A PETITION MEANS

You can void an open petition, but you cannot void one once it has been closed or filed. Voiding a petition releases any E-QUAL signatures collected and <u>cannot be undone</u>. If the petition was created for the wrong office or jurisdiction, the candidate would want to void it. If the candidate decides not to run, they can void their petition which would allow voters to sign another candidate's petition.

HOW TO CLOSE A PETITION

1. UNDERSTAND WHAT CLOSING A PETITION MEANS

When you close a petition, this means voters cannot add more signatures to your petition. This action cannot be undone. However, you can create supplemental petitions to gather more signatures up to the minimum number of signatures for the office, if needed.

Instructions

- 2. To create a candidate profile, you will first have to create a new login. New login requests are submitted to Clean Elections staff and reviewed as soon as possible. You will receive an automated notice upon approval. A candidate or representative of a candidate (such as a campaign manager) may create/edit a candidate profile. The information submitted should reflect whomever is setting up the profile and the candidate's name must appear in the "Candidate to manage" field. After this is done hit "Create Request".

Political and Campaign Signs

CITY OF YUMA COMMUNITY PLANNING AND NEIGHBORHOOD SERVICES

Political signs for candidates and election issues need to comply with the City of Yuma Sign Code (§ 154-17). For further information, please contact the Department of Planning and Neighborhood Services at One City Plaza, Second Floor or call 373-5000, ext. 3003.

The Location of Political and Campaign Signs:

- The City of Yuma Code prohibits any sign to be located within any public street right-of-way as classified by the circulation element of the Yuma General Plan, nor shall any portion of a sign or sign structure overhang such right-of-way (§ 154.17.05(F)), however, the State of Arizona's Attorney General has opined that political and campaign signs may be located within the public rights-of-way that are owned or controlled by said jurisdiction as stated in Arizona Revised Statutes (A.R.S. §16-1019).
- 2. Signs shall not be located in a manner which is hazardous to public safety, obstructs clear vision for pedestrians or vehicular traffic in the area or interferes with the requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act (§ 154-15.03(C) and § 154-17.05(E)(3)).
- 3. The signs can be installed on **private property**, with the property owner's permission. Installing a sign on **public land** requires the permission of the agency that controls the land.
- 4. Any entity or person placing a sign is solely responsible to the safety of the traveling public. The City of Yuma does not condone or approve the locations of signs and will only intervene as permitted in A.R.S. § 16-1019, as amended.

Sign Registration and Sign Permit Requirements

The size of the sign dictates:

- If the sign is <u>exempt</u> from registration,
- If the sign is required to be <u>registered</u> with the City, or,
- If the sign requires a <u>building permit</u>.

The following table summarizes City sign <u>registration</u> and <u>permit</u> requirements:

Length of Time Signs are Allowed

• Signs may be posted for a specified period, in accordance with A.R.S. § 16-1019.

Candidates for office and/or their managers and staff chiefs are responsible for removing campaign signs and the support materials in a timely manner and restoring the location to its pre-sign condition. Failure to remove these signs and abate the area after the election places an unnecessary burden on the local jurisdictions to use public resources to undertake this task. Moreover, leftover signage or damaged signage creates a negative impression to the area and places an unnecessary blight to the community. As such, candidates and their managers and staff are respectfully asked to monitor their signs and remove them as soon as practicable after the conclusion of the election.
