a. Director's Update

- i. Master Plan Update
 - Conservation Technix was selected as the Consultant to complete the Master Plan.
 - We held the kick off meeting
 - A survey to collect community input has been approved and will be mailed to 4,000 random addresses and will be available online.
 - o Survey will be open for several months.
 - o Have the commission help to spread the word.
 - Community engagement sessions October 25-26 from 6:00 pm to 8:00 pm
 - Separate sessions will be scheduled for the Commission
 - A second round of community engagement sessions will be schedule in the spring to collect more refine information.

ii. Grant Updates

- The City has received enough funding to complete the inclusive play project at West Wetlands.
 - Yuma Regional Medical center pledge all 3 pieces for the East Mesa Community Park.
- The West Wetlands Playground Trail grant in the construction phase
- The East Mesa Community Park Loop Trail grant agreement has been received.
- Art featured.
- Water conservation grant \$3 million grant for irrigation with \$1 million match.
- The City is assisting the Yuma Crossing National Heritage Area with in-kind support to execute a tourism grant for garden landscaping at West Wetlands Park from the Hummingbird Garden to the Solar Garden.
- The Department of Forestry and Fire Management awarded the City a new grant for the next phase for prevention

The Arizona Commission of the Arts awarded the City a \$21,000 for the arts.

iii. Project Updates

- Beach restoration project is underway. Several beach areas were washed away due to the BOR water released.
- New shade structure at Desert Ridge Park and Windsor Park.
- Inclusive Play Project completion at West Wetlands
- Smucker restroom CXT unit is in the final approval stage.
- Starting the process for the installation of new restroom at the Sanguinetti Athletic Complex. The Carver Park restroom is now open.
- Musco lighting will be installed at Ray Kroc Fields 2 and 3 in June 2024 and July 2024.
- Replacement of the Kennedy Hockey Rink dasher board and flooring.
- Kennedy Skate Park 60% design has been approved. Estimating to break ground in January 2024.
- East Mesa Community Park 60% design is being reviewed. Estimating to break ground in June 2024.
- The kiln project at Yuma Art Center is waiting for the approval of the awning installation.
- A call for artist has been mailed for the Yuma Art Center sign outside of the building.
- Yuma Civic Center marquee is complete.
- Yuma Civic Center new freezer is installed.
- Desert Hills Golf Course kitchen renovation is complete.
- Ramada 11 at Caballero Park and Ramada 25 at Carver Park have been reopened.
- The Adopt-a-Spot and Adopt-a-Park programs are under legal review.
- The Park Patrol program is being developed with an estimated launch date of January 2024.
